Physical Description:

This collection is made up of two ledgers and a few business papers of Charles C. Perkins, one of the sons of Eliphalet Perkins III of Kennebunkport. Charles and his brothers were involved in a shipping business with their father and were among the most prosperous men in Kennebunkport in the 19th century. Charles was also one of the original members of the Boston and Kennebunkport Sea Shore Company, developers of the shoreline of the Kennebunks in the latter 19th century.
