Newton Booth Tarkington was born on July 29, 1869 in Indianapolis, Indiana. He was named after his maternal uncle, Newton Booth, then the governor of California. He graduated from Phillips Exeter Academy, and attended Purdue for two years. After two years he transferred to Princeton University, and was active in the college's dramatic society. He also was an editor of the Princeton *Bric-a-Brac* and provided many of the drawings in the 1893 edition. Although he attended two prestigious colleges he never graduated from either, lacking a single course in the classics. He received honorary masters and doctoral degrees from several institutions, and won many awards for his writing. He is the only author to have won two Pulitzer Prizes, for *The Magnificent Ambersons* in 1918 and *Alice Adams* in 1921. Tarkington was the author of dozens of books and innumerable short stories. He was married to Laurel Fletcher from 1902 until 1911, and was married to Susannah Robinson until he died on May 19, 1946.

In the late 1920s he began to lose his eyesight, eventually going blind. He continued to write by dictating to his secretary, Elizabeth Stanley Trotter, a Philadelphia socialite. He maintained a home in Indianapolis all of his life, and from the mid-teens he also had a home in Kennebunkport that he first rented and later bought, called Seawood. In Kennebunkport he was known as a sailor, and his schooner, *Regina*, was moored next to his boathouse, called "The Floats."

He was author Kenneth Roberts mentor and lifelong friend.

This collection is Elizabeth Trotter's personal collection. It was originally at St. Francis College in Biddeford, which later became part of the University of New England. It was given to the museum by Barbara Swarzlander, Public Services Director, Libraries of the University of New England in the summer of 2007 when she felt it was no longer of use to UNE and could be better utilized by the Museum.

The collection is housed in 24 boxes, 12 of them flat boxes to hold magazines, and the remaining are document boxes and pamphlet boxes. There is a group of photographs that are housed in the photograph collection by number. The *List of Books and Plays* (2007.073.0001-2007.073.0066d) is housed upstairs in Building 4 on the bottom two shelves to the right with the other Tarkington/Roberts books. The collection is numbered 2007.073.0001-0446. In the collections of the museum are a piece of the *Regina* and a small, oval photograph of Seawood with birch bark and straw frame.
